McCormick Elementary School is making a positive difference in the lives of children by promoting academic excellence that transfers to capabilities that can span the globe in productivity, personal responsibility and career expertise as anticipatory of South Carolina public school graduates all while in a safe and nurturing environment necessary for learning. We design our purpose with a school theme, "Raising the Temperature to Reach Our Goals." We move this theme into action by providing a challenging instructional program for students to demonstrate growth and proficiency with continuous teacher professional development. Teachers use powerful and innovative strategies for instructing students in the classroom that include science kits, reading interventionist, math interventionist and computer software. We monitor and adjust our efforts as needed to continue the academic success of all of our students. To support academic success, our students are taught social skills that encourage making good choices. Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is a framework that allows us to teach appropriate behaviors and makes provisions for incentives such as school bucks and school socials for our students who exemplify expectations. Classroom guidance lessons are taught to classes weekly. Small group and individual guidance sessions are held as needed. Lessons and sessions assist students with conflict, bullying, study skills, peer pressure and good decision making. Red Ribbon Week is celebrated to remind our students to be free from drug abuse. Bully Prevention Week activities are presented to spotlight the devastating results of being bullied and to teach ways to prevent and stop this crime. Bully prevention is also a part of weekly classroom guidance. A mentoring program is available to students experiencing social and behavioral concerns. Community members as well as school personnel act as mentors. To also support academic success, our parents are invited to visit with children during special events. These occasions are great opportunities to experience home and school connections such as: Muffins for Mom, Doughnuts for Dad, Pancakes for Parents and National Fathers Take Your Child to School Day. McCormick Elementary School embraces a student council and National Honor Society which provide members opportunities to be recognized as leaders. We believe that our children can grasp worldwide distinction. We are "Raising the Temperature to Reach Our Goals".






