A. J. Lewis Greenview Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills, life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by incorporating research-proven strategies in classroom instruction, interventions and extra-curricular activities. This will ensure that the individual needs of each student are met. Our school serves the needs of 430 students and is located in a well-established neighborhood in northern Columbia. The general school population consists of students whose families have lived in the area for generations and whose parents attended school here. As in the past, our students have shown consistent academic growth that will prepare them for future success. Our 2014 PASS results indicated a need to continue focusing on developing students' skills in math and science. Therefore, the teachers and other instructional support staff will continue to develop research-based and innovative instructional strategies in math and science. We will continue strengthening our professional development activities through the use of Professional Learning Communities.

Highlights include having five National Board Teachers on staff. Our Odyssey of the Mind teams won first and second place honors at state competition, thereby qualifying to compete in the World Finals Competition. The school was awarded \$5000 from a Healthy Schools Grant to purchase PE and recess equipment to promote a quality recess time. We received an All Health Award in the amount of \$2500 for our Fitness Club to build an activity trail on the school's grounds. In addition, the school received an Alliance for a Healthier Generation Bronze Award for promoting an active lifestyle, healthy eating, and health education in the school and community.

Parent and community involvement are an integral part of the school life. With the collaboration between the Parent Teacher Association (PTA), School Improvement Council (SIC), and school's volunteer program, our volunteers work in the cafeteria, media center, classrooms, office area, serve as advisors for extra-curricular activities, and student mentors.




The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






