

WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

Our 13th year was a huge gator success! Lake Carolina went through a unique split in the campus due to our growth. Third through fifth graders were moved to a new school, Lake Carolina Elementary Upper Campus and our school became a primary campus serving child development through second graders. Our school was recognized for the twelfth year for closing the Achievement Gap for historically underperforming students. We earned a "Gold/Gold" on the SC State Report Card. This is the highest academic honor recognized by the State Department of Education. Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by utilizing brain based teaching strategies each and every day. We have a variety of opportunities for students. We offer after school clubs like drama, nature club, and art, but also offer science, engineering, foreign language, karate, cheerleading, dance, sports fundamentals, golf, and gymnastics. Our Later Gator after school program served approximately 60 children. In addition, qualifying students had the opportunity to participate in Response to Intervention. The LCE Leadership continued to focus on opportunities for 2nd grade boys and girls to learn and build competency skills in leadership. Interesting statistics about our school include that our 451 students read continuously with 243 students earning their Reading Counts t-shirt. Each day we averaged over 375 books checked out in our Media Center. Lake Carolina has 12 National Board Certified teachers. In addition, LCE's partnership with the University of South Carolina as a Professional Development School brought 12 interns and student teachers into our school during the course of the year. Based on the feedback from our Health Advisory and School Improvement Council surveys, strategies which included Exercise Counts, were implemented to increase our focus on heart healthy living. Our School Improvement Council sponsored an extremely successful uniform sale. Service learning projects selected and supported by our SIC were as follows: Pawmetto Lifeline Animal Shelter, Boxes of Love for Palmetto Place Children's Shelter, St. Baldrick's Foundation for Children's Cancer Research. Our PTO Board also sponsored Family Fun Nights, Gator Fest, father/daughter dance and mother/son bowling night. Due to the dedication and commitment of TEAM LCE and the support and pride of our parents and community, our accolades are many. However, what we truly cherish is our sense of community where TOGETHER we will continue to "sail beyond excellence" for ALL children at Lake Carolina Elementary School. Andrea C. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






