

## WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

High Point Academy (HPA) opened its doors in August 2014 in Spartanburg, South Carolina as a part of the South Carolina Public Charter School District. High Point Academy is a community-centered school built on the principles of honor, integrity, and service where academic excellence, STEM education, fine arts, and a project based, applied learning style of instruction produces an educational environment rich in creativity, innovation, and achievement. At the heart of the educational mission is the growth and shaping of tomorrow's leaders, challenging them to dream, deliver, and desire success. Teachers use innovative ways to encourage student learning through a hands-on approach along with community service projects. Student progress is monitored through a variety of sources, including the iReady Program, in order to accommodate individual student needs. HPA offers an extended day for all students, which includes a free after school program. HPA serves students in Spartanburg and surrounding areas. There are approximately 408 students in grades kindergarten through ninth during the 2014-2015 school year. Of those students, 71% are White, 20% are African American, and 7% are two or more races. There are Asian, Hispanic, and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander students in the school, but these all combine to comprise 2% of the population. Of the school population, approximately 49% qualify for free and reduced lunch. HPA consist of 3 kindergarten teachers, 2 first grade teachers, 2 second grade teachers, 2 third grade teachers, 1 fourth grade teacher, 2 fifth grade teachers, 6 middle/high school teachers, 8 special area teachers, 3 resource teachers, 2 assistant principals (one part time and one full time), and 1 principal. Many of the teachers have received a master's degree or are currently working on a higher degree. There are several teachers who are SAFE-T and mentor certified within the building. Teachers are regularly sent to workshops and conferences in efforts to continue their education. HPA will extend to include tenth grade in the 2015-2016 school year. High Point Academy achieved many things in it's inaugural year. We will continue to inspire and shape our learners to become the leaders of tomorrow.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






