

Cane Bay High enjoyed another successful year as one of the State's top schools. Our commitment and efforts toward data-driven instruction continues to pay dividends. We continue to enhance student opportunities in Career Pathways by expanding course offerings in S.T.E.M., Health Sciences and Advanced Placement courses while adding partnerships with areas businesses. Our students continue to meet our high expectations with exceptional scores on End-of-Course Exams, AP Tests and the newly Implemented Work Keys and ACT Statewide Testing. Our graduation rate continues to surpass the state's average as well as the district's. Cane Bay Fine Arts upheld its reputation as the most talented school in the Tri-County Area by earning straight superior ratings for Band, Chorus and Orchestra, all groups received All-State recognition as well. The marching band made it to the state championships for the 2nd year in a row. The visual arts won more local awards than most schools in our region combined. The newly formed Cane Bay Drama Company amazed viewers with its productions. Teachers in the department continue to receive accolades, including Grammy recognition for 2 of our teachers! Cane Bay continued its winning ways with several teams making playoff appearances, with a few state champions. Our own Athletic Director was named 7- 4A Region Athletic Director of the year for a 2nd year in a row. Our Teams were cheered on by our exceptional cheerleaders whose competition squad made it to the State Finals this year. We are also were proud to have 3 winners from the State Strength Competition. Cane Bay earned recognition on a state and national level with our student participation in various student organizations, clubs and teams. Our HOSA Chapter, Robotics Team, Virtual Enterprise and DECA all had students place at state competitions. Our JROTC Program earned the Distinguished Unit Award, with one of our instructors also winning Instructor of the Year. Cane Bay also earned the SCASCD Award for Student Engagement. This award recognizes schools who engage their children in communities and schools. Although Cane Bay High School is successful in many areas of student achievement, we face the continued challenges of meeting the needs of a quickly growing student population. We continue to refine the overall effectiveness of our Professional Learning Communities, offer rigorous professional development opportunities to the faculty and staff, and to challenge ourselves to accelerate student performance while maintaining high expectations for success at all levels.



Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing




The ACT, a college readiness assessment, was given to every South Carolina 11th grader in 2015 with the exception of those eligible for alternate assessments. The ACT scores range from 0 to 36. The district and state averages are included for comparison. State averages for ACT data are based on regular public schools and do not include private schools in the state.

ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
