



Daniel High School and the School District of Pickens County are helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by caring for students and providing them with a safe environment that allows each student to succeed in an academically challenging learning environment. This environment is driven by our mission statement that says that we strive to prepare students for the challenges and opportunities of an ever-changing, technological, global society in a safe, caring, and community-supported environment. Our student population includes 1099 students in grades 9-12. DHS has established a tradition of excellence in all areas of our school that are recognized throughout the state. US News and World Report once again ranked Daniel High as one of the top 10 traditional public high schools in South Carolina for 2014-15. At DHS, we strive to help instill in our graduates the world class knowledge, world class skills, and life and career characteristics that will make them successful and productive members of our society after their high school career is complete. Academically, our students are exposed to rigorous coursework, including 20 AP courses in which 395 students were enrolled. Daniel High's EOCEP, SAT, and ACT scores are traditionally above the state and national averages. In 2014, Daniel's ACT composite score of 24.1 was the highest in the state amongst traditional public high schools. Our EOC scores continue to rank well and show improvement as our teachers work to address new standards in preparing students for these exams. DHS students continue to excel outside the classroom as well. Extra-curricular clubs and organizations promote leadership and community service and are vital to our school and student success. Our Math Team and Academic Team continue to perform well in state and national competitions, and our Chess Club won its eighth consecutive South Carolina State Scholastic Chess Championship. Our fine arts program had another great year as highlighted by the D.W. Daniel High School Band program earning the prestigious 2014 Outstanding Performance Award given by the South Carolina Band Directors Association. Our faculty strongly supports the belief that we are responsible for helping all students learn through innovative and collaborative educational opportunities. Weekly after-school tutoring sessions are staffed by a dedicated group of teachers. Our Fast Track program has targeted a cohort group of 9th graders and provided them with educational support systems and real-life experiences like job shadowing to help them get a head start towards earning credits for their high school diploma, some in just 3 years. The teachers at DHS have high standards for themselves and they use their professional development opportunities via PLCs, Early Release Days, and staff development times to work together to learn and share best practices. Over eighty percent of the faculty have advanced degrees and twenty of them have achieved their National Board Certification. Through their continued hard work and dedication,

Average ACT Score Achieved by Students: Writing



ACT WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system measuring "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information, and Locating Information. Students can earn certificates at the Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze level on WorkKeys assessments.
