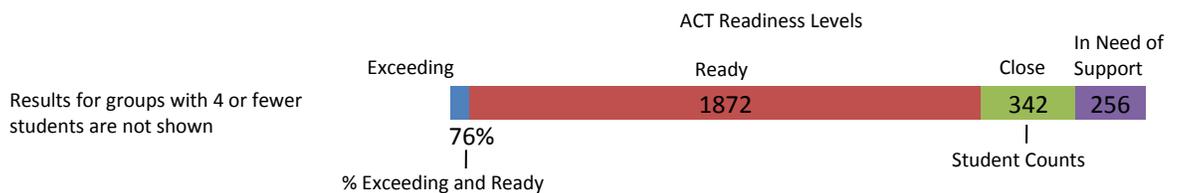

Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Lewisville Middle School (LMS) is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe environment and a culture of rigor and high expectation. At LMS, we offer high school level half unit credit in the areas of Keyboarding and Computer Apps for all students in addition to high school credit courses in English and Math for honors students in 8th grade. In order to satisfy intellectual curiosity, the newly formed Lewisville Lioneer Robotics Team competes at the local and state levels in the First Lego League (FLL). Virtual book clubs have been introduced by the media specialist through Edmodo to motivate students to read more books and to join Team Read. Also, as part of the Chester County 1:1 hiTEC initiative, all eighth graders recently employed HP tablets in their classes. In the coming school year, this technology will extend to sixth and seventh graders as well. Representative of the need for students to understand America's position in the global economy, an Envision World Class Scholars partnership was created between eighth grade students and a class in Kastav, Croatia. The classes spent real time together every other Friday on Google Hangout learning about each other's cultures. The two schools, nearly 5000 miles apart, worked together to create a collaborative cross-cultural learning environment for the students. The collaboration between the schools allowed the students to virtually bring their classes together for a 21st century learning experience. The experience will help prepare the students to be globally competitive. Further increasing students' employability and college readiness, students continue to practice collaborative skills with cooperative learning activities school-wide. Likewise, the Lewisville Middle School staff works as a Professional Learning Community to analyze data, share instructional strategies, and discuss ways to improve both individual and overall student achievement.




