


WORLD CLASS SKILLS & LIFE AND CAREER CHARACTERISTICS

Dr. Phinnize J. Fisher Middle School is a designated Science, Technology, Engineering, ARTS and Math Middle School with a building designed specifically to facilitate our unique curriculum and schedule. We opened for our inaugural year in 2014 – 2015 with a sixth grade class and will add an additional grade the next two years. Dr. Phinnize J. Fisher Middle School students receive a rigorous, well-rounded education using an inquiry and project-based learning model. Our school culture fosters an environment of inclusion, enjoyment of learning, and exploration where all children are encouraged to succeed. Through our interdisciplinary, hands-on approach, our students are given the necessary tools and nurturing to develop individually and ultimately reach their highest potential. Our school offers traditional core courses and a number of related arts classes in our four-by-four alternating block schedule. Our students are taught predominantly through the project-based learning model. Through projects, students learn the academic content, practice 21st Century skills such as collaboration, communication, and critical thinking, and create high quality, authentic products and presentations. Our School Improvement Council (SIC) is a representative group of parents, teachers, administrators, and business/community members. It has become an effective collaborative group whose objectives are to establish, monitor, and evaluate school site goals designed for ongoing school improvement. Likewise, our Parent, Teacher, Student Association (PTSA) has had a tremendous positive impact on our school culture. In working with the faculty and staff, our PTSA has become a visible support system for our growing student body. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






