

International Baccalaureate Results

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO), founded in 1968, is a nonprofit educational foundation based in Geneva, Switzerland. The foundation offers a comprehensive two-year curriculum—available in English, French, and Spanish—that allows students to fulfill certain requirements of various national education systems.

The IBO’s Diploma Programme is a high school program offered to students in the final two years of school and requiring that a candidate take one subject from each of the following six groups: (1) the “Language A1” group is the student’s first language and includes the study of selections from world literature; (2) the “Second Language” group is a language and literature course in a language other than the student’s first language; (3) the “Individuals and Societies” group includes courses such as geography, history, psychology, anthropology, and business and management; (4) the “Experimental Sciences” group includes biology, chemistry, physics, environmental systems, and design technology; (5) the “Mathematics and Computer Science” group includes four math options related to the candidate’s anticipated need for math beyond high school (for example, a math course intended for students who will take higher-level math in college related to subjects such as physics or engineering); (6) the “Arts and Electives” group includes visual arts and music and theater arts, as well as Latin and classical Greek, along with the option of a second subject from groups 1 through 4 or a further course in mathematics.

Each test in the subject groups is graded on a scale of 1 to 7. The following table displays, by school, the 2009 results provided by the IBO in September 2009, for South Carolina public school students taking IB subject-area tests and receiving a score of 4 or higher (4 = satisfactory performance; 5 = good; 6 = very good; 7 = excellent). No performance data are provided by the SC Department of Education for subgroups smaller than five in the scores category.

The following table displays, by school, the number of South Carolina public school students who were 2009 candidates for diplomas (students in the second year of the two-year IB program can register as diploma candidates when testing), the number who were awarded diplomas, and the percentage of diplomas awarded. Students who display satisfactory levels of performance across all subject areas and achieve a minimum of 24 points (out of a possible 45) are awarded the IB diploma. Where fewer than five diplomas were awarded, no results are given (--).
