

District Superintendent's Report

In 2007-2008, Kershaw County School District averages were higher than the state averages in 20 of the 24 possible 2007 PACT categories. The district's average SAT score was the 13th best in the state, making it 29 points above the state average.

Kershaw County seniors improved their average composite score on the ACT college entrance exam by six-tenths of a point. Four of the district's schools—Baron DeKalb Elementary, Blaney Elementary, Lugoff Elementary, and Mt. Pisgah Elementary—were recognized by the Education Oversight Committee for reducing the achievement gap for at least one historically underachieving student group in 2008. Five schools—ATEC, Blaney Elementary, Lugoff-Elgin Middle, Midway Elementary, and Pine Tree Hill Elementary—were recognized by the State Board of Education in the Palmetto Gold and Silver program for high levels of academic achievement and high rates of student academic improvement. Eighteen more Kershaw County teachers earned National Board certification this year.

Under the i-CAN program, all of the district's high school students received laptops, high school teachers also received laptops and staff development in computer-based instruction. The program will continue through the 2008-09 school year along with increased technology for kindergarten through eighth grade students and teachers.

The school board broke ground on seven construction projects in 2007-08 as part of Phase One of the \$102.2 million facilities equalization program. All construction projects have been on or ahead of schedule, and extra cost savings from these projects will allow the school district to build a new elementary school in Camden and address facility needs to serve approximately 500 more elementary students in the West Wateree area in the next ten years.

The district's extraordinary performance has received statewide and national recognition at all levels. Lugoff-Elgin Middle was one of two middle school finalists in the Carolina First Palmetto's Finest Award program. Doby's Mill Elementary received the Blue Ribbon Lighthouse Award and its Media Specialist was chosen as "Media Specialist of the Year" by the South Carolina Association of School Librarians. Four schools—Camden Elementary, Jackson, Lugoff-Elgin High and Mt. Pisgah Elementary—were named Red Carpet Schools, bringing the total number of Kershaw County schools who currently hold this honor up to 12. Baron DeKalb Elementary's PTO was one of 24 individuals and organizations to be recognized by the State Board of Education for outstanding contributions to South Carolina's public education system. Camden Elementary received honorable mention in the Dick and Tunky Riley School Improvement Award. The school district's Distance Education Learning Center was honored as the "DELIC of the Year."
