



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The 2007-2008 school year was eventful, challenging, and a success for the students, teachers, parents, and the Oconee County communities.

We opened the new West-Oak Middle School and added an addition to Hamilton Career Center. We began making plans for using Code Elementary as the Adult Education/Family Learning Center.

The achievements of our students helped us gain recognition as a school district that could compete nationally. Our Palmetto Silver and Gold Winners were Northside Elementary, Code Elementary, and Hamilton Career Center.

Six hundred and four students graduated from Seneca, Tamasee-Salem, Walhalla, and West-Oak High, earning \$9.5 million in scholarships. On the state's exit exam, 83.7 % of Oconee tenth graders passed on the first attempt, outscoring the state with an average of 77.1. On the nationally MAP our students consistently score above the national average.

The Education Foundation in its revival in the last two years has awarded over \$95,000 to teachers to enhance the teaching of science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics, and service learning (STEAMS). The annual BBQ event this past May was a successful collaborative effort between the City of Seneca, Arts on the Alley, and the Education Foundation.

For the second year in a row, the School District of Oconee County helped Oconee County earn the coveted America's Promise award as one of the 100 Best Communities for Youth!

"Education is Everyone's Business," is our motto in Oconee and we believe that this motto is what makes us unique.

I want to thank the dedicated teachers, parents, and community that support us everyday and thank them for making my first year as superintendent as one of the best years of my career.
