



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The students, teachers, and administrators of Richland School District Two continue to bring honor and praise to our district. Because of the hard work of those groups, our journey toward "World Class" status continues. As a result of our efforts to improve academics and manage district growth, Richland Two became home to another Palmetto's Finest school, bringing the total to 12. 3 of our schools were awarded Palmetto Gold Awards and 2 received Palmetto Silver. 4 schools were recognized as Red Carpet Schools; and 6 schools were recognized for their progress in closing the achievement gap.

Blythewood Middle School was recognized as a National school to watch. Dent Middle and Killian Elementary won state-level awards for their single-gender programs. Spring Valley High School was named one of the 50 Best High Schools in America by Siemens and the College Board. Richland Northeast High School is one of three Midlands public high schools on the Newsweek/Washington "Post Challenge Index." This year we opened a new middle school, and after welcoming almost 1300 new students, Richland Two is now the largest district in the Midlands with over 23,000 students.

The Richland Two Youth Action Council was awarded a \$100,000 State Farm grant. E.L. Wright Middle School's News Bowl Team was national champion for the 8th consecutive year. The North Springs Elementary Academic Bowl Team placed 1st in the state. Blythewood High School won the State 3A Track Championship, and the Spring Valley High School Soccer Team was ranked #1 in the nation. The ranks of our faculty include the S.C. Special Needs Teacher of the Year, the S.C. Preserve History Teacher of the Year, the S.C. Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development Outstanding Administrator of the Year, the South Carolina Association of Student Councils' Administrator of the Year, the South Carolina Association of School Administrators' W.B. Harley Administrator of the Year, and the S.C. Association of School Resource Officers' Educator of the year - just to name a few. The district also continues to lead the State in teachers achieving National Board Certification. Richland Two, with 412, currently has more National Board Certified Teachers than any other district in South Carolina and more than many individual states.
