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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This has been another good year at Hannah-Pamplico High School. Our report card rating for 2007 (Good) confirms our continued success in the classroom. In our rural setting, we maintain efforts to encourage good citizenship and lifelong learning. Over half of our student body participates in athletics and/or student government. Our students are also responsible for various student publications, service projects, a community art festival, and an African-American Read-In.

We offer peer tutoring, job shadowing, subject-related field trips, competitions, and a credit recovery program. Students and community members also served on our School Improvement Council as they made key decisions on school-related issues.

Some of our academic and athletic successes include the following: 6 students scored 1100 or higher on the SAT, with 4 scores over 1200; 83% of our calculus and English students passed the national AP exam; 31 of 67 ranked seniors graduated with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, based on SC Uniform Grading Scale; 3 Palmetto Fellows recipients; 20 of 67 seniors are eligible for the LIFE scholarship, based on the CHE standards; 7 of 67 seniors are eligible for the HOPE scholarship, based on the CHE standards; 1 student will participate in the SKILLS USA national conference; JROTC groups won 1st place in drill and marksmanship competitions, color guard competitions, and field day activities; Special Services participated and placed in our Regional Special Olympics; our automotive technology department received a \$5000 grant this year from SCADA; and maintained its NATEF certification and our Academic Challenge Team won championship for Region 1A (5th time in 6 years).

The community is, and has always been, a vital part of decision-making. Personal attention to each individual's needs continues to be the driving force behind our success.
