


REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2007 – 2008 school term was an exceptional year at Blackville-Hilda High School. We can point to a number of significant achievements this past year with a real sense of pride and satisfaction.

BHHS was a Silver Award winner in the Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards Program for 2007. This honor was earned through the improved performance of our students on state mandated assessments.
