



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Wade Hampton High School students have a lot to be proud of. The graduates of 2008 will receive over one and half million dollars in college scholarships. Four students were named Palmetto Fellows, two students were selected to attend the Governor's school, and a number of students were recognized in national competitions. Mandatory test prep classes for tenth graders helped students improve their test taking skills and prepare for the HSAP, EOC, SAT, and ACT. As a result, the EOC scores climbed. In addition, Life Scholarship winners increased from 10.2% to 16.3% and the graduation rate increased. "College Credit Now," and the new Early College Credit program through the Technical College of the Lowcountry has given over thirty students the opportunity to receive dual credit for college courses.

The Marching Red Guardsmen band once again placed in the Lower State Competition. Ten band members were named to the All-Region Band and four went on to place in the state competition this year. NJROTC received the distinguished unit achievement award given to the top thirty percent of ROTC programs in the nation. The Boys' and Girls' Cross Country team each won region championships and went on to compete in the state finals. The Girls' Tennis and Soccer teams won the region championship, as well. The Red Devil baseball team tied for the region title and won the District Eight Championship. This year's Red Devil basketball team won the Region championship for a third consecutive season.

This was another successful year for Jobs for South Carolina Graduates, a program designed to help high risk students in danger of failing high school. The JAG students competed at the state conference and several students were able to travel to Washington, D.C. for the national conference. Thanks to our students, teachers, parents and community volunteers for making Wade Hampton High School a Red Carpet School. With continued support and hard work Wade Hampton High School will continue to produce future leaders of South Carolina.
