



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

A.C. Flora High School serves students from urban, suburban, and rural home settings. The socio-economic populations range along a continuum from wealth to poverty. Approximately 52% of our students are white, 40% African-American with the remaining 8% of students representing more than 17 languages other than English. Proudly, A.C. Flora High School is synonymous with diversity.

The graduating class of 2008 includes six National Merit Finalists, one National Merit Scholarship, a recipient of Furman's Hollingsworth Scholarship, 32 International Baccalaureate Diploma candidates, 32 Richland One Academic All-Stars, 20 Palmetto Fellow participants, 46 Life, and 50 Hope Scholarship offers representing 41% of the graduating class.

Flora has 20 National Board-Certified teachers and is a leading school in the district for this accomplishment. We were regional champions in boys' swimming, girls' golf, girls' basketball, girls' tennis and boys' baseball. In the state championships, we were third in boys' swimming, third in girls' golf, second in baseball, and state champions in golf. We have two Academic All-Americans in swimming, and we have one individual state champion in golf and one in the high jump. A. C. Flora has been the H. B. Rhame Award Winner for the past four years, the top athletic program in the Richland One school district. We currently offer 47 team sports with over 650 students participating.

Visual and performing arts flourish at Flora and a rigorous curriculum includes Honors, AP, and IB course selections. Our Nova Net Lab provides students credit recovery support, and the Mentoring Always Generates Increased Confidence (MAGIC) program provides male students with support from community business men. Also added were broadcast journalism and the Columbia Student Leadership Institute.

In order to support transitioning students from the eighth to the ninth grade, the Freshman Academy was reorganized to include its central location, its principal, as well as its own guidance counselor. Furthermore, to assist students in concentrating on career decisions, the Guidance Department was reorganized. Last, the High School That Works Initiative (HSTW) focuses on increased student achievement.

The consistently high volunteerism and parent involvement at A.C. Flora uniquely represents a significant commitment to the school's success. We openly solicit parent involvement in planning for the future of our school. Community members and business partners enrich our student environment with their support.

A.C. Flora focuses on continuous data collection and interpretation to drive school-based decision making. Ongoing faculty staff development assures high quality, challenging, and appropriate instruction for all students.
