



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2007-2008 school year was filled with many successes at Spartanburg High School. Our students and staff earned local, state, national, and international recognition in academics, fine arts, performing arts, athletics, and community service. Our students, staff, parents, School Improvement Council and community are committed to providing world-class educational opportunities for all students.

We would like to share a few of our accomplishments: we were recognized by Newsweek magazine as one of the top high schools in the country based on our Advanced Placement program. Our AP passage rate on 528 tests increased to 82%, highest in the county and seventh highest in the state. Our SAT scores increased, and we were one of seven districts in the state above the national average. We were one of eight schools in the state to receive a Palmetto's Finest visit. We had 10 students named as National Merit or Achievement Finalists. Twenty-four of our students earned the S.C. Academic Honors Award. We had 139 seniors receive the Life scholarship and 36 received the Palmetto's Fellows Scholarship.

SHS was one of four schools in the country to be invited to participate in the International Educational Summit in Beijing, China. Our Summer Reading program was featured in a national article by Kathleen Parker and in Principal Leadership, a national educational journal. We were a featured school with Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence for the third year in a row. A new tutoring program with Converse College was begun. Several students and a guidance counselor traveled to South Africa as part of our international exchange program.

Our girls track team won the AAAA state championship for the third year in a row, and our Boys Basketball team won the upper-state championship. The S.C. High School League recognized forty-six of our students as Scholar-Athletes. Our Chorus had thirteen members earn All-State honors. Our JROTC program was named Honor Unit of Distinction for the 14th year in a row. Spartanburg High School's Class of 2008 earned merit based scholarships totaling over 8.9 million dollars over a four year period.

Spartanburg High School is synonymous with excellence. We seek to be ever-changing and ever-improving in order to meet the needs of all of our students. It is our philosophy that every child deserves a quality education and the opportunity to achieve success.
