



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Northwestern High School, supported by a community that logged over 77,000 volunteer hours and a teaching staff of 96 members (12 National Board certified members with 70% of the entire staff holding a Masters degree or higher), prides itself in providing opportunities for all students to be successful academically, artistically, and athletically.

**Academically:** Northwestern students continue to perform well at the national and state levels on standardized tests. Three hundred sixteen seniors met all state and district requirements to receive a South Carolina Diploma. Seventeen seniors graduated with "Highest Honors" for carrying a 4.5 or above cumulative grade point average. Sixteen seniors graduated with "Honors" for having earned at least a 4.2 grade point average but less than a 4.5 GPA. Seven seniors completed the academic and extracurricular requirements for the prestigious International Baccalaureate Diploma. Sixty-five members of the Class of 2008 were awarded the Gold Seal diploma for having earned a minimum of 28 units in the 9th thru 12th grades with no individual course grade lower than a "C", or have a cumulative GPA of 4.2 or higher. Nine graduates were awarded The State of South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Diploma based upon criteria established by the State of South Carolina Board of Education. With eighteen students eligible for the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, the combined monetary value of all scholarships awarded to the Class of 2008 exceeds \$6,750,000.

**Artistically:** Our visual and performing arts programs were again state leaders. In the visual arts, our students exhibited in local, state, and national competitions with many award winning artist recognized. Northwestern's performing arts program produced over fifty All-State performers. Our school's orchestra continues to grow, scoring superior ratings in our state's most prestigious competitions. The Purple Regiment competed in the Bands of America Regional against other top bands from around the country, finishing in the top ten. For the past eighteen years the South Carolina Band Director's Association has recognized Northwestern's band program as one of the states very best awarding the program with its most prestigious honor, the "Outstanding Performance Award". Northwestern's Drama department presented multiple shows throughout the year, one of which was the highly acclaimed "High School Musical." Northwestern's choral ensemble, the Troubadours, continues to seat All-State singers as they perform locally and around the state.

**Athletically:** Fielding thirty three teams, over seven hundred student athletes competed on teams in one of the state's most competitive regions. This past season, our nineteen varsity athletic teams won five region championships, with recognition going to seventy All-Region athletes and twenty All-State athletes. All but one varsity sport represent Northwestern in the states post season competition. Our Boys' Soccer team, ranked nationally, won the state 4-A championship for the second time in three years. In the 2008 graduating class, one hundred two seniors participated in athletics. Northwestern is proud to announce that forty-eight seniors were recognized as Scholar athletes with fifteen of those graduates signing letters of intent with colleges and universities.
