



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2007-2008 school year was a historic one for South Pointe. The school graduated its first senior class. While standing upon the ideals put forth in our school's seal—Integrity, Community, and Excellence—many members of this class of 235 students have risen to the high expectations this community has established for our schools in the areas of academics, the arts, and athletics.

Many of those seniors accepted the challenge of the administration and faculty to take the most rigorous courses they were capable of successfully completing. Ten graduated with highest honors, while fourteen graduated with honors. Forty-one members of this Senior Class are Gold Seal Endorsement recipients.

Twenty-eight International Baccalaureate candidates completed the academic and extracurricular requirements for the International Baccalaureate Diploma and took IB examinations in six subjects. South Pointe had the second largest number of full-IB Diploma Seniors in the state of South Carolina and was number one in terms of the percentage of Senior full-IB candidates.

There were many notable accomplishments during the school year. The student newspaper, South Pointe in the News (SPIN), earned an All State rating in its first year of overall competition at the state level and won the 2007-2008 South Carolina Scholastic Press Association Palmetto Award for its class of competition. The Stallion Corral Concert Choir had eight students attend All-State Chorus, with one being named the number one second soprano in the state. Three students received superior ratings at Vocal Solo and Ensemble competition, and the Concert Choir received a rating of superior at State Contest and placed fifth in the state of SC among 50 choirs.

The South Pointe High School Band of Thunder had a very successful year, earning the Outstanding Performance award for the first time in school history. The band finished 3rd at Upper State and 6th at State and won its first-ever grand champion award by winning the 1A/2A grand championship at BandBeat. The school year was a successful one for the South Pointe strings program. The orchestra had their first performance at SC Concert Orchestra Festival and came home with a Superior rating.

We have also been successful in athletics, although we were one of the smallest schools in 4A competition. Highlights included the varsity girls' basketball team finishing first in the region with a record of 23 wins and 3 losses and a trip to the upper state championship game at Clemson University.

The faculty and staff continue to utilize the staff development days to plan strategies to enhance instruction and student learning. We look forward to building upon our successes during the 2008-09 school term.
