

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Lewisville Middle School is one of the three middle schools in the Chester County School District. The school received an absolute rating of average on the South Carolina Annual School Report Card. Lewisville Middle School is proud to announce its achievements for the 2007-2008 school year.

The school continued and expanded on its successful school-wide reading program by including the following activities: Real Men Read/Foxy Ladies Read reading program, establishing the Team Read Café, and participating in the "Kids Who Read Succeed" program. Students were awarded various incentives for reaching their reading goals.

Four students were selected as Junior Scholars. One hundred percent (100%) of the students taking the end of course tests in English I and Algebra I received passing grades. The school's Academic Challenge Team competed in events during the school year. A number of Lewisville Middle School's seventh and eighth grade students were members of the high school's marching band.

The school continues to use its Good Character program and Advisor/Advisee program to develop good citizens throughout the school. The school participated in and exceeded its expectations in the following service learning projects: Pennies for Patients, March of Dimes, and The Empty Stocking Fund.

The Making Middle Grades Work program continues to be an important school-wide initiative that supports articulation between Lewisville Middle, Lewisville High, and Lewisville Elementary Schools. A morning tutoring program for the students was provided from funds related to the school's renewal plan.

The Parents In Action Team and the School Improvement Council continue to be valuable assets to the school. The school business partners (Mr. Larry Terry, Wal-Mart, and Coca-Cola) continue to provide financial support and services to the school. Data teams reviewed all data (MAP, report cards, PACT, etc.) in making decisions that provided quality instruction to the students.

Special activities provided by the school this year were the Multicultural Month Celebration, the Mega Party Celebration, Medieval Times Festival, and the Washington, D.C. field trip. A successful FAST Team graduated a total of nineteen families during the school year.

Lewisville Middle School will continue to provide a safe environment and quality education to all of its students. Lewisville Middle will continue to make decisions in the best interest of the students and is committed to making strides through academic programs, extracurricular events, and lifelong character-building efforts.
