

District Superintendent's Report

Allendale County Schools have witnessed a significant change in instructional focus over the past eighteen months. The emphasis has gone from mere remediation to providing instruction that emphasizes excellence in programs of choice. This emphasis has increased parent and community confidence in the schools as demonstrated by a decrease in student mobility.

New summer programs for middle and high school students included a middle school technology camp, a new partnership with USC-Salkahatchie for a middle school Summer Arts Camp, and a partnership with the South Carolina Department of Commerce and the South Carolina Department of Education with the Microburst program for high school students.

ACSD is dedicated to providing quality instruction to our students. A system of direct teaching and learning based on the tenets of Hunter's Lesson Cycle has been implemented. All administrators are required to monitor the implementation of this process and to give specific feedback to teachers. The MAP test is used to monitor student academic progress as well as to provide the foundation for creative instructional interventions. These interventions may include the use of technology based programs such as SuccessMaker, I Can Learn, STAR Academy, Plato and eLGP. The Alternative Learning Center boasts a specialized program of instruction for students find that they are unable to conform to traditional instructional settings.

An increased emphasis on parent communication and involvement has been initiated through the District's Parent Liaison office's use of a parent hotline.

We thank our teachers, staff, parents, business partners and community members for their continued support as we move forward to improve student achievement in Allendale County Schools.
