

## District Superintendent's Report

Thomas Payne's quote, "These are the times that try men's [and women's] souls," could well describe the 2008-2009 school year. Although there is much to celebrate in Bamberg School District One, it has indeed been an unparalleled year in terms of the financial crises that our small, rural district continues to face. Even during the most challenging of times, however, our district staff and faculty have remained focused on student achievement and our goal of empowering every graduate of Bamberg-Ehrhardt High School with the ability to face life in the 21st century with skills and knowledge that will serve them well throughout life.

The district continues to place a strong emphasis on early intervention through its CDEPP 4K program and a regular 4K program, as well as those children who are identified through our CHILD FIND activities. We also have a strong working relationship with the county's First Steps program. These collaborative efforts have proven successful in preparing our young learners for academic success early in their school careers. We are also beginning to see the fruits of our many years of the Reading First Initiative, which encompasses grades 5K through Grade 3 at Richard Carroll Primary School (RCPS), as these youngsters are now entering Bamberg-Ehrhardt Middle School (BEMS). Improved reading skills are evident throughout all core coursework at these middle grades. Richard Carroll Elementary School (RCES) continues its intense planning among grade level teachers to ensure consistency in the presentation of all state required academic indicators. The transition of students and staff from Ehrhardt Elementary School (EES), which closed after the 2007-2008 school year, appears to have gone smoothly, and the town of Ehrhardt is in the process of accepting the school property from the district to be used for the benefit of the citizens of Ehrhardt. BEMS received an E2T2 discretionary grant in the amount of \$200,000 that has allowed the middle school to have a technology coach as well as a significant amount of technology hardware. This will be of tremendous assistance as we work to ensure our students' technology proficiency for the future. Bamberg-Ehrhardt High School (BEHS) continues its forward progress using the High Schools That Work model for guidance. The electronic Individual Graduation Plans (eIGPs) were completed at the rate of 100% for all rising 8th, 9th, and 10th grade students, the first district in the state to achieve 100% completion.

Bamberg School District One is proud of its tradition of excellence academically, athletically, and artistically. With EES and BEHS receiving Palmetto Gold Awards and RCES receiving the Palmetto Silver Award, our Red Raider Band and baseball team both winning the Class A state championships for the second year in a row, we sincerely believe that Bamberg School District One is "the place to be."
