

In these efforts and in all ways, we strive for unmatched excellence in academics, athletics, activities, and the arts. In academics, Spartanburg High School had six students named as National Merit Finalists, and the school was named by Newsweek as one of the top schools in the country in recognition of its Advanced Placement program. In arts, the District Seven Orchestra Program sent 28 talented high school orchestra students to China for a concert tour during the summer 2009, which included playing at the very prestigious Xian Music Conservatory Concert Hall. In activities, our students participated in over 34 clubs and organizations, Student Government, Student Advisory Council, JROTC, Career Education, job shadowing opportunities, as well as produced the award winning yearbook, SAGA. In athletics, the district recently added lacrosse as one of 23 varsity offerings for boys and girls. We have made extensive site improvements at the athletic complex on campus and at Duncan Park. All the athletic facilities improvements at SHS will be second-to-none and will provide excellent facilities for not only its athletes but also the residents of the district.
