



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

This Report Card is a communication tool designed to help parents and community members get a snapshot of progress for Horry County Schools. It gives you insight as to how we perform on key indicators of the state's accountability system, along with statistical data about our students and the educators who serve them.

This has been a challenging year as we worked to make adjustments for reductions in State funding. We made every effort possible to protect classrooms while making cuts for a \$20 million shortfall. While our business matters can sometimes seem overwhelming, we should never lose sight that our students are making progress toward the goals set for themselves and those for their school and district. The Report Cards provide a great deal of detail about gains made in assessments, but there are other items that warrant our celebration.

Twenty of our schools were awarded Palmetto Gold and Palmetto Silver Awards for overall performance and for gains made in closing the achievement gap among subgroups of students. Twelve schools were honored by the SC Education Oversight Committee for significantly improving the performance of low achieving students. Midland Elementary School was a nominee for a National Blue Ribbon Award, and our Scholars Academy students were state champions in the We The People: The Citizen and the Constitution competition.

Green Sea Floyds High School was one of 19 high schools in South Carolina to be ranked among America's Best High Schools according to U.S. News & World Report. For the fourth year in a row, Socastee High School was listed among America's Top Five Percent of High Schools according to Newsweek magazine and ranks first in the state in the percentage of students scoring a 4 or higher on IB exams and second in the state in the number of IB diplomas earned. Loris High School was one of five high schools in the nation to be named a MetLife NASSP Breakthrough School and was a finalist for the Palmetto's Finest Award. Also, our graduating class of 2009 collectively earned \$36 million in scholarships. Of the 2,179 graduates, 78 percent planned to continue their education at either a four-year or two-year post secondary school.

Our student enrollment increased by more than 600 students, slightly less than previous years but still enough to fill a new elementary school. We anticipate growth to continue but at a slower pace until there is some improvement in the economy. We know our future building projects will focus on adding classrooms to elementary schools. We plan to get more use out of our middle and high schools by moving toward higher utilization models.

It has been an exciting and challenging first year as superintendent. I hope you will continue to offer your support as we work toward becoming one of the highest performing school districts in the nation while helping all students reach their potential.
