



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## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Lee County School District continues to see improvement in many areas. The results of the district's measures of success on PASS, HSAP, and EOC, indicate that the district has been improving in many grade levels and subject areas tested. The County School Board of Trustees' mission is to ensure advancement in student achievement by both a strong system of accountability and required resources.

The district continues to implement strategies, programs, and accountability measures to ensure the attainment of the adopted goals by 2009-2010. These goals focus on securing and allocating adequate financial resources to accomplish the mission of our district, increase student achievement in all areas, decrease the number of students identified for special education, and increase the number of students enrolled in Gifted and Talented courses and Dual or Advanced Placement courses. We also continue to focus on an increased graduation rate and providing a safe and orderly school culture.

The district continues to link professional development to school, district, and personal goals; support and expand professional learning communities; expand and strengthen action research as a way to respond to assessed student needs. The district continues to use MAP and other formative assessments to help craft instruction. We continue to seek additional fund sources to supplement instruction and increase student achievement.

The district continues to develop quality curriculum and professional development for all grade levels and subject areas. The curriculum guides and other support documents continue to be reviewed and updated regularly. Homework centers and/or after-school tutorial programs are available at all schools.

The district continues its efforts to upgrade all facilities. The district has begun construction on a new middle school scheduled to open on the same site as the high school. This project is slated to be complete by the start of the 2009-2010 school year.

The efforts described in this narrative are evidence of our commitment to provide a quality education for the students of the Lee County School District.
