



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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Thank you for taking the time to look over our district report card with its valuable information concerning student performance indicators. The Board of Trustees and administration appreciate your involvement in and support of our schools.

To provide programs that continue to challenge our students and staff, several initiatives have been implemented, including open enrollment and the International Baccalaureate Program at Hendrix Elementary, the option of single-gender classrooms at HES and Boiling Springs Intermediate, Army ROTC at Chesnee High, a Scholars Academy in partnership with USC Upstate, a college entrance program with Spartanburg Community College, and the availability of instructional coaches in every school. Outstanding literacy staff development for and instruction by our teachers with the "100 Book Challenge" at the elementary level, "Plugged Into Reading" at the middle level, and the availability of "Read 180" at the high school level are the bedrock of our literacy programming. Curriculum guides in all content areas have been updated with massive collaboration between our teachers and District staff over the past two years.

Our schools are safe. Staff training and emergency drills are conducted regularly, a modified lock-down status is daily practice, all schools have a nurse, and school resource officers are provided at middle and high schools. Camera systems are on buses and in schools. A secure environment is essential for learning.

Our student population growth persists. Through wise use of resources, the district has kept pace without approaching taxpayers for a school building bond referendum. Boiling Springs and Chesnee High schools had expansions open this fall, and the construction of Rainbow Lake Middle School is underway.

This past June, 579 students (a record) graduated with over \$14 million in scholarships (also a record), while our achievement on state grade-level tests continues to place us among the top 10 in South Carolina. Music and art awards continue to accumulate, and athletic programs are flourishing.

Spartanburg School District Two is a wonderful place to live and work. The presence of faith and strong families enable us to more easily educate your children. Thank you for choosing to live here and for working with us in this most important endeavor.
