

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

We are delighted to announce that Carolina Elementary met all the student achievement goals based on 2008 Palmetto Achievement Challenge Test (PACT) results. We also met Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) by achieving 17 out of 17 criteria. The data is posted on the district website (darlington.k12.sc.us) or the state website (scode.com).

Carolina was one of three South Carolina schools nominated for the National Blue Ribbon School Award. We also received the Darlington County District 5 Star Award for a friendly and welcoming school environment. One of our fifth grade students won the Darlington County District Art in Business Award for the students in grades 3-5. Angela Weathers, our new first grade teacher, was named as a district finalist for Outstanding First Year Teacher. In May, we received the Red Carpet Award from the South Carolina Department of Education for the second time in five years.

November was an exciting month with the book fair and readers from the community in celebrating of American Education Week with us. In February, we had our first Science Showcase. Each class prepared science activities for parents to visit. Some of the events included mixtures and solutions, magnets, and motion. Parents and friends toured the school and students explained the activities. The fourth grade and first grade presented musicals this year. In April, we had our Field Day at Byerly Park in Hartsville. We all walked to the park, participated in the Field Day Activities, and walked back to a delicious hot dog lunch in our cafeteria. Everyone had a grand time.

As part of National Network of Partnership Schools (NNPS), we provided "Drive-through Breakfast" to our parents twice during the year. We also hosted three Principal's Chats to share school topics and concerns. Parents set up the publishing center in our Parent Resource Room for our students' writing projects. Our media center hosted Dr. Sara Odom as visiting author of Gram's Switch. Dr. Odom was a teacher at Carolina and is now a published author, as well as a professor at Coker College.

Carolina is part of the Darlington County Technology Plan. This year we received three more Promethean Boards for our classrooms. These boards provide opportunities for interactive instruction for students and teachers. All regular classrooms are now equipped with a Promethean Board. Teachers have been trained and are actively using the new technology. Web pages, for each classroom, are available for the public to view.

The PTO is working on a fitness trail for our playground area. We plan to publish a cookbook in the fall to help fund this project.
