

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

E.P. Todd Elementary acts to guide all students to reach their highest achievement with personal integrity. Todd has been the proud recipient of the Palmetto Silver Award for student achievement from 2006-2008. Our well-trained staff has worked diligently to increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Palmetto Achievement Challenge Tests (PACT). We are a recent winner of the Spartanburg Writing Project's Writing Program Excellence Award, and we were recognized as a Red Carpet School in 2002, for which we are reapplying this year. The 2007-2008 school year saw us once again add several multimedia classrooms at Todd. The majority of the intermediate classrooms now have this technology, and our primary classes will begin receiving it in the future. Wofford College students have begun partnering with us to tutor kindergarten and first grade students in Spanish. Southside Baptist Church volunteers come to our school each Tuesday to tutor children in grades 1-3 in Reading. Two teachers at Todd began Montessori training in the 2007-2008 school year, and we opened two kindergarten Montessori classes this year. Fifty children enrolled for this first year of Montessori education at Todd this year, and we will have four classes in 2009-2010. Projected enrollment for Montessori in the 2009-2010 school year will exceed 100 students in just our second year of offering the program.

We are fortunate to have a strong PTO at Todd. Our school's PTO helps fund musicals, helps to fund special activities during the year for each grade level, sponsors two book fairs and two carnivals each year, and funds the Tiger Pride celebrations we have each 9 weeks for students who are working hard and behaving well at school. Todd has won state awards twice in the past decade for leadership in business education because of our partnership with Junior Achievement. We are also a certified Schoolyard Nature Habitat, which is given by the National Wildlife Federation, and we have also won the South Carolina Healthy Schools Award.

Through the collaborative efforts of teachers, students, and the community, we will continue to improve and show our "Tiger Pride" in all that we do.
