

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2008-09 school year at North Aiken Elementary proved to be a great year for the students, teachers, staff, and parents. The school was a recipient of the following grants: South Carolina Department of Education Math and Science Unit, USDA Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Program, SCANA Homework Center, Wal-Mart, and Exxon Mobile. In addition, North Aiken, in partnership with Aiken Middle School and the City of Aiken, received the Safe Routes to School Grant. North Aiken collaborated with various individuals, businesses, and organizations for the Annual International Walk to School Day. Nationwide Learning, Inc. Student Treasure Books were created by 278 North Aiken Elementary students. Students continued to participate in the Universal Breakfast Program. North Aiken had 37 students who participated in MathFest, a statewide math competition held in Columbia, where 10 students received medals for placing in the top 15 in their grade levels and 1 second grade student placed as the top student in the state and received a trophy.

North Aiken partnered with the University of South Carolina Aiken as a Professional Development School for early childhood practicum students. The teachers at North Aiken continued to provide quality education based on best practices. Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) was utilized as an assessment tool to assist teachers in providing individualized and small group instruction for students. The percentage of third grade students and fourth grade students who scored basic and above on the 2008 ELA PACT exceeded the district's percentage. The percentage of fourth grade students who scored basic and above on the 2008 Social Studies PACT exceeded the district's percentage.

There were various opportunities for parents and family members to participate in parenting events. Some of the major parenting events for 2008-09 included the following: Grands Are Great, Empowering Dads Breakfast, Empowering Moms Breakfast, Literacy Night, and Art Extravaganza. Family members were also encouraged to participate in the North Aiken Community Events. The following are some of the community events: Bowling Night at Park Avenues Lane, Movie Night at the Planetarium – USCA Ruth Patrick Center, Evening of Storytelling at the Aiken County Public Library, North Aiken Night at Applebee's, and Augusta Green Jackets Baseball Game.

We thank the students, teachers, staff, and parents for a great year. We look forward to continuing to work together to meet the needs of the students. We encourage input from parents, community members, teachers, staff, and students.
