


## PASS PERFORMANCE

These programs included: Bright Beginnings, SCE&G Homework Center, and Taylor Learning Center. Our PTA, as well as community members and businesses, continues to provide unlimited support for EES. Estill Elementary School fathers painted the inside of the cafeteria during the Christmas Holidays. SCE&G continues to fund our after school homework and enrichment center. They created a partnership with their parents called FUN FRIDAYS, in which all kindergarteners left their book bags at school.
