

The first year at Bridge Creek has been a wonderful experience, and we are looking forward to the start of our second year. We were able to establish a school culture that is focused on teaching and learning and which created pride among our students and staff.

We are excited about the formation of the first SIC and PTO, which is comprised of parents and business partners committed to meeting the needs of our children. Our SIC was able to conclude its first year with a school uniform initiative which was supported by over 70% of our K-4 families.
