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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The 2008-2009 school year was once again successful at Blacksburg High School. Our students and teachers performed well in all areas of school life. We have experienced significant achievements throughout the school year. Academically, our students continue to score above the state average on the South Carolina Exit Exam, and preliminary results indicate what we hope to see, an increase in our overall scores on both the SAT and ACT. Artistically, our programs continue to grow and produce outstanding results. Our piano lab, hand bell choir, and chorus continue to expand and we have added drama to our curriculum. Our band program has a reputation of excellence and continues to be very competitive in both state and invitational contests. Athletically, several of our teams advanced into the state playoffs with a number of student athletes earning all-region honors.

We have just completed the sixth year of our academy program and there is substantial evidence that it is paying academic dividends for our students. We also have increased our dual credit offerings enabling more of our students to attain college credit before their high school graduation. We are continuing to use credit recovery to prevent students who may be struggling academically from falling behind. Because of this program and the diligence of our teachers and staff at Blacksburg High School our graduation rate has significantly improved to the point that we are in the top ten percent of the schools in South Carolina in terms of graduating seniors.

Many of our students submitted entries to various district, state, and regional contests. A significant percentage of them won awards and commendations due to their outstanding efforts including a state winner and sixth place nationally in the "Voice of Democracy" entry. Our students also participated in events such as blood drives, fundraisers for cancer research, recycling projects, CPR training classes, and other projects to improve our school and community. We were also very proud to be named as a Palmetto Gold school for the second consecutive year.

Our challenge remains to build on these achievements. We will do so by continuing to improve our educational programs, providing better services to our students and continuing to upgrade our facilities. Our school staff and community are determined to make Blacksburg High School an even better school, one that will continue to provide ample opportunities for all students and teachers to excel.
