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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

We continued to have many successes at McBee High School. The Class of 2009 received over 1 million dollars in scholarship monies. We embarked on our first year as a High Schools That Work site, as well as a Making Middle Grades Work site.

Our reading initiative continues to make progress. The Summer Reading Program is in its 7th year, and again, we amassed over 29,000 points in our Accelerated Reader Program.

We fulfilled part of our technology plan with the installation of Promethean Boards in every classroom and have trained all classroom teachers in the use of this equipment. The laptop initiative continued, with the 8th grade participating in Project Based Learning.

Eighteen seniors graduated with at least 6 hours of college credit due to our Dual Credit Agreement with Northeastern Technical College.

We received a grant from the State Department of Education in the amount of \$150,000 to install Wi-Fi capability in some of our school buses and are planning the implementation of an on-campus studio through which live and/or streaming videos may be accessed by our school and community.

McBee High School again met AYP and was the recipient of a 2008-2009 Palmetto Silver Award for General Performance.
