As Palmetto Silver Award Winner for the 2008-2009 year, Emerald High School is committed to achieving excellence. Emerald High School offers a positive and inviting academic environment where all students can learn and are challenged to pursue higher standards of excellence.

Students perform exemplary in the classroom as well as on the field. Our students have won many national and state awards. Two of our students were national merit scholarship semifinalists; one student was an overall winner of the national merit scholarship award. Five Emerald students were honored by the Kiwanis Club as the top SAT scorers in Greenwood County. We have 15 palmetto fellows scholars, 11 academic honor graduates, 43 national honor society graduates, 15 national technical honor society graduates, numerous life and hope scholarship recipients, and 2 air-force JROTC honor graduates for the class of 2009. These scholarships and grants constitute an excess of 2.9 million dollars in awards, over 600,000 dollars more than last year's amount. In addition, Emerald High School has won many state awards in track and field, and two state wrestling championships this year.
