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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The 2008-2009 school year was one of transition and growth for students and faculty at Laurens District 55 High School. Mr. Wayne McIntosh brings many years of experience and wisdom to his role of principal of LDHS. We are delighted to have been named a South Carolina Palmetto Silver Award Winner for improvement in student achievement. Our chief initiative this year centered around Professional Learning Communities within our school community. These small groups of teachers met to examine student work and review professional literature in a collegial setting. The single purpose within these groups was to refine and perfect instruction to better impact student achievement. All faculty members were trained in structured protocols to guide the work of the groups. English, Mathematics, and Science teachers participated in departmental studies where the focus was using literacy-rich instructional strategies in the classroom. Mathematics teachers spent much time this year developing and implementing benchmark tests and common assessments as they worked to improve student achievement in mathematics classes. The Class of 2009 finished their high school careers in a stellar manner. 276 seniors earned South Carolina Diplomas. Collectively this class was offered more than \$2,500,000.00 in scholarship funds. Two seniors received the South Carolina Academic Honors Award this year. Debbie Simpson, a member of the English Department, was the 2008-2009 Teacher of the Year for LDHS and for Laurens County School District 55. We hold deep respect for Mrs. Simpson and the work she does for our students at LDHS. We are proud of the education students at Laurens District 55 High School receive as we work to develop life-long thinkers and problem solvers who are equipped to meet the challenges of the 21st century work force.
