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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

During 2008-09, Blythewood High School expanded to a student population of 1,976. The implementation of a new schedule for our weekly adviser-advisee program (PAWS-Planning and Advisement With Students) increased student access to interest groups and clubs and extended the focus on smaller learning communities (SLC's). A three-week cycle was developed by teachers, matching the PAWS schedule to our reporting periods for interims and report cards. Students met with advisers regarding academics one week, completed house activities the next week, and moved to student interest groups or clubs with an adult sponsor on the third PASSPORT week. This schedule has significantly increased student participation in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Blythewood High added staff to support two new career clusters: one for law, public safety, and security, and a second for building construction. A second band director was added to expand the band program to include world music in the fine arts curriculum and to enrich interdisciplinary studies with the integration of world music across the broader curriculum.

Blythewood High is home to a National Merit Finalist, a National Spanish exam award winner, and one student who received cum laude on the National Latin Exam. We are proud of the student who obtained a perfect score on the verbal section of the SAT. A Blythewood High student placed first in the state Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) career development competition, and several students competed in the DECA International Career Development Conference. Four of our health science students achieved national nurse's aide certification, and one was elected to state office for the Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA). Blythewood High's teacher of the year and chef for the culinary arts program was a contender for the national ProStart teacher of the year.

In their first year of 4A competition, Blythewood High Bengals won the state girls' lacrosse championship, the individual track state championship in the boys' 400 meter, and the boys 4x100 team relay championship. The Blythewood High School girls swimming, girls tennis, volleyball, girls golf, softball, and girls bowling all earned region championships. The Bengals placed one player on the All-State Boys Golf Team.
