



Charlestowne Academy was founded by parents in 1996 as a Core Knowledge K-12 school with strong parental involvement. During its brief existence, Charlestowne Academy, a SACS accredited school, has received many accolades including six Palmetto Gold Awards.

Only one teacher, Katherine Thornton, has taught at Charlestowne Academy since its inception.
