




READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Faced with the challenge of providing top level educational opportunities in a learning rich environment for teachers and students alike in a deteriorating economic setting, Gaffney High School has done an outstanding job in the 2008-2009 school year. Despite budget cuts in all sources of revenues, we were able to move forward in many areas. Sixteen new staff members helped invigorate both the old building (relatively speaking) and the new ninth grade wing. The purpose of the new addition is to provide a close community setting in which ninth graders can be successful academically as well as socially. With an energetic, student oriented staff to guide them through their first year of high school, our expectations are very high for a reduction in the number of ninth grade repeaters in the future. This new facility contains 30 classrooms, including 6 state of the art science rooms/labs, along with a cafeteria, office complex, guidance suite and computer rooms suitable for classrooms or individual tutorials.

Of the 424 graduates in the class of 2009, 181 were eligible for the LIFE scholarship. Our academic achievements along with first time State Championships in baseball and softball and individual medals in track continued the School of Champions tradition.

This summer we are initiating a credit recovery program which will replace summer school. By combining this program with an absentee program and continuing both into the regular school year, we are aiming to improve our on-time graduation rate as well as providing a viable option to those students who may be considering dropping out.

With a dedicated staff & student body, we look forward to the future.
