


READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Improving academics and student achievement continues to be the focus for Woodland High School. This year Woodland received the Palmetto Silver Award for its improvement in academics and the graduation rate. Our graduation rate improved by ten percentage points. Woodland also was awarded a banner from Project Lead the Way for its engineering program.

The graduating class of 2009 received over 1.8 million dollars in scholarship funds. Twenty-one students were enrolled in college credit courses. Twenty students received the Life Scholarship, and one student received the Palmetto Fellows Award. The robotics team participated in state and national competitions. Each athletic program, with the exception of baseball, competed in the state playoffs.

The faculty, staff, parents, and the community continue to strive to prepare our students to successfully compete in the ever-changing global economy.
