


READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Wilson High School Tigers enjoyed an incredible school year in 2008-2009. Not only did our students enjoy success academically, but they also represented Florence School District One extremely well in athletics and the arts. We are proud to proclaim that our students, with the encouragement of a caring faculty and supportive alumni, forged their mark in Wilson history. Some of our outstanding accomplishments include the following:

- In the Class of 2009, 17 graduates were recognized as Board of trustees' scholars (GPR between 4.5000 and 5.8700), 28 graduates obtained a Double cord (GPR between 4.0000 and 4.4999), and 84 obtained a Single chord (GPR between 3.0000 and 3.9999)
- 1 National Merit Scholarship Recipient, 3 National Merit Finalist, and 2 National Merit Semifinalists
- 17 Palmetto Fellows
- 1 South Carolina State Board of Education Academic Achievement Honors Award Recipient
- \$3,450,000 in scholarships earned collectively by the Class of 2009
