

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We are excited about our continued progress in student achievement in 2008-09, culminated by graduating 337 seniors with scholarship offers of more than \$7 million. We focused on helping our students to acquire 21st century skills needed to be successful in the workforce or at the next educational level. Teachers used data from various programs to improve End-of-Course test results in Physical Science, English I, Algebra I, and US History as well as SAT, ACT, and HSAP. Our "We the People" team finished first in the State and competed nationally in Washington, DC. We received the Law Related Education High School of the Year award from the SC Bar Association. Our NJROTC unit received the "Unit Achievement" award from the Navy. Our student newspaper was awarded an All-Southern rating, All-State, and the Palmetto Award from the SC Scholastic Press Association. Our student broadcasting program received a SIPA Superior rating and was awarded the SCSA All-Southern rating. Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) students placed in ten events in District competition; four students placed first in their category, and one student won the "Voice of Democracy" state competition. Our Fine Arts department presented 13 sold out performances of the Broadway musical CATS. Our show choir won the Grand Champion award at the PAC National Freedom Festival in New York, with one student named best soloist. Theater students competed in the Coastal Carolina University festival with two students placing in the top five for monologue and a student placing first in technical theatre. Our CFHS concert band received a superior rating at the SCBDA state concert band festival. Our athletic teams captured seven region championships in our first 4-A year. Also, the majority of our varsity teams entered state playoffs, with an individual earning silver medalist in girls' track. We would like to thank everyone for their support as we progress toward our goals. Without your assistance, our continued progress would not be possible.
