

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Spring Valley High School enjoyed another banner year in 2008-09. Spring Valley was recognized by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators as Palmetto's Finest High School. Spring Valley received an Excellent Report Card and was named a Palmetto Gold Recipient by the State Department of Education. Our academic successes have been tremendous. Spring Valley's SAT, ACT, and AP Scores were all above the National Average. Our Math and Mock Trial Teams were very successful in State Competitions. The students in our Magnet Program won over 60 awards for science research at the South Carolina Junior Academy of Science Competition. The senior class had 6 National Merit Finalists, 37 Palmetto Fellows, 49 High School League Scholar Athletes, 34 South Carolina Academic Honor Graduates, 83 Hope Scholarships, and 113 Life Scholarship Recipients. This senior class surpassed all other classes in Spring Valley history with over \$41 million in offered scholarships, and over 61% of the seniors received a scholarship. Our ROTC Drill Team won the State Championship for the 24th consecutive year, and they were the overall National Champion ROTC Unit. In athletics, 10 teams won Region Championships, and our Girls Basketball Team won the State Championship. Spring Valley was named the Midlands High School Athletic Program of the Year by the State Newspaper. Forty-one teachers have earned National Board Certification. Josh Drews was named Secondary Art Educator of the Year, Dr. Chris Selby was named South Carolina Orchestra Teacher of the Year, and Dr. Glenda George was named South Carolina Secondary Level Assistant Principal of the Year. This year, Spring Valley implemented Viking Way (Freshmen Academy), Smaller Learning Communities Grant, Drop Out Prevention Program, and Instructional Practices Assessment.
