


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Kennedy Middle School has approximately nine hundred and twenty-four students, of whom sixty-six percent are Caucasian and thirty-four percent are minority. Thirty-three percent are on either free or reduced lunch. The school has two self-contained special education classes, two resource classes, an English as Second Language class, and two hundred sixty-four students enrolled in the Gifted and Talented program.

Academically, the students have scored well above the state and district averages on all standardized tests. Students are heterogeneously grouped in grades six and seven and, because of high school credit course offerings, are homogeneously grouped in the eighth grade. All students are offered an advisor-advisee class, two periods of language arts and mathematics daily, and have science and social studies for two periods on alternating days. In addition, each student has a minimum of six exploratory course offerings yearly. To support the academic program, all students participate in Accelerated Reading, Accelerated Math, and the CAI (Computer Assisted Instruction) Lab. Students who are experiencing academic difficulties are offered tutoring through parent volunteers, Beta Club members, and an after school tutorial program.

A wide variety of extra curricular opportunities are provided for students through clubs, athletics, intramurals, and mini-courses, and students participate in a variety of service learning and character education activities. The KMS National Beta Club inducted 126 students this year, bringing our total membership to 349. Our undefeated Academic Team earned the 2009 District Championship. Our Serteen Club was named International Chapter of the Year for 2009. Our band produced two All State, fourteen Region, and twenty-one All Conference band members. Our football team was conference and county champions; our volleyball team was conference champions; our girls and boys basketball teams had 9-3 records; and our golf team was county champions and also undefeated. We also welcomed a new MoMD (moderate mental disability) class with six amazing students. In summary, Kennedy Middle School strives to ensure that every student achieves success.
