


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2008-2009 school year at HPMS was an exciting year with continued growth. The students performed well academically, and the HPMS community worked together to accomplish many successes:

Nine of our 8th grade students were recognized as SC Junior Scholars;

One seventh grade student was recognized as a Duke TIP Scholar;

An eighth grader was the Honea Path Middle School Spelling Bee winner and placed 5th at the Anderson County Spelling Bee;

Students in grades 5-8 participated in the school Science Fair. Grade level and school winners were recognized at a district awards ceremony;

Thirty-one students participated in the Science Olympiads, placing 8th overall; In the various competitions, six students received 6th place ribbons, six received 5th place ribbons, three received 4th place medals, and one team of two students received two 3rd place medals.

Students in grades 5-8 participated in a number of service activities totaling 14,675 hours of service. One hundred thirty-four students received the Presidential Award for Service Learning: 27 received the gold award, 18 received the silver award, and 89 received the bronze award.

HPMS's 2008-2009 Teacher of the Year was Mrs. Beth Cannon, and Mrs. Patti Barrett was selected to serve as HPMS Teacher of the Year for 2009-2010.

The staff has been busy with the improvement of instruction as we begin our twelfth year as a Standards Based Curriculum School. Our goal of maintaining and improving our standardized test scores will be addressed in a variety of ways, including a 21st Century Grant that enables us to provide Merit Academy (after-school program for at-risk students); PLATO, Study Island, and NCS Learn Lab (computer lab) programs that continue to help improve academic skills; and technology upgrades, including Promethean Boards that aid in classroom instruction.

We appreciate the support of our PTO, School Improvement Council, and Business Partner. The PTO held fundraisers to purchase student supplies and assisted in numerous school activities. We salute our parents, local industry, businesses, and community, and we thank them for their continued support. Together we are building a brighter future and opening the door for a new century of progress.
