


Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide





REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Cario Middle School continues its tradition of excellence in academics, arts, athletics, and extracurricular activities. Cario is widely recognized as a highly successful middle school with a large campus, a small-school atmosphere, and huge opportunities for students. On the school report card, Cario earned the highest absolute achievement index rating among all non-magnet middle schools in Charleston County School District (CCSD). Cario's students have consistently demonstrated mastery of rigorous academic standards. Cario provides a quality honors program at all grade levels, as well as a structured system of interventions for students who need academic assistance. There are numerous opportunities for students to earn high school credits, and Cario has one of the highest percentages of students identified as gifted and talented (GT) in CCSD. Cario students compete in academic challenges such as the SC Science Olympiad (2nd place in the state), American Mathematics Competition (certificate of merit), Math Counts competition (1st place in the region), Wando High School Math Competition (1st place in Algebra), CCSD Spellbound Spelling Bee, National Geographic Geography Bee, and Greek Mythology Bee. Students may take exploratory courses such as Spanish, pre-engineering, health, drama, fitness, and keyboarding. Our Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) scores delineate growth in reading, mathematics, and language usage across all grade levels.

Cario students demonstrate excellence in arts and extracurricular activities. Visual artists have earned numerous awards, including two first place ribbons at Trident Technical College's Quest competition. Drama students performed several plays. Orchestra students received superior ratings at the SC Concert Festival. Cario's band received the state's Outstanding Performance Award for the eighth consecutive year and earned superior ratings at the SC Concert Festival. The Cario Chorus earned a "superior plus" rating at the Solo & Ensemble Festival, and four Cario singers were selected to the National Honor Choir. Cario teams competed in football, volleyball, cheerleading, soccer, tennis, swimming, golf, baseball, and softball. Student council sponsored a talent show, and the yearbook staff produced a high-quality publication.

The Cario staff has participated in on-going professional development (PD) in order to meet the needs of our students. PD focused on the SC curriculum standards through use of the CCSD Coherent Curriculum, an advisory program for students, instructional technology, active engagement, rigor and relevance, and differentiated instruction based on students' needs. Cario's faculty includes twelve members who have earned National Board Certification, thirteen teachers with GT endorsements, and forty-seven percent of the teaching staff with advanced degrees.

Cario Middle School uses the Making Middle Grades Work model to implement positive changes in our school. We recognize the importance of high expectations, rigorous academics, and a safe, supportive learning environment for all students. As partners in education, our faculty and staff, parents, and community members support and actively participate in making Cario Middle School a model for educational excellence.
