


## PASS PERFORMANCE

## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Welcome to Gaffney Middle School where we all "Believe, Achieve and Succeed." The 2008-2009 school year was very successful and productive. Our students and teachers worked diligently to make learning exciting and authentic. By using the South Carolina academic standards and district curriculum, we provided lessons that were innovative and motivating. High expectations were held across all grade levels for students to achieve their best. Our administration recorded over 700 teacher observations this year. We were visited in the fall by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools for a district-wide accreditation visit.

We have had great parental participation with parents attending parent - teacher conferences, Student of the Month lunches, athletic games, Chorus and Band concerts, Fine Arts Expo, Battle of the Brains, Field Day and many more activities. Parents have been supportive in several community service projects including Relay for Life and March of Dimes. We were recognized as the middle school raising the most money for the March of Dimes.

We are fortunate to have received a 21st Century Learning Community Grant to provide an after-school program to assist in meeting the academic, social, emotional and physical needs of qualifying students. Our teachers and staff are committed to students as evidenced by their willingness to work in the after-school programs.

We completed the second year of our four year South Carolina Reading Initiative grant. Our teachers have received extensive staff development in comprehensive reading and assessment in a bi-monthly study group provided by the literacy coach and administration. Appropriate literacy materials have been purchased for the classrooms, literacy center, and media center to implement a solid reading program.

Technology continues to increase in our instructional program. This past year, all classrooms were equipped with Activboards for interactive lessons. In addition, each classroom has a document camera, LCD projector and wireless laptop computer to use in the instructional program. We also provide our parents the opportunity to review their child's progress and attendance through the web-based program InTouch. Parents receive calls on a regular basis through our automated phone system, Alert Now, which notifies parents and students of events, assignments, and happenings in the classroom. To tighten security and to have a record of our visitors, we have installed a new computer program with photo capabilities for all visitors to sign in and out.

At Gaffney Middle School, education is a team effort among students, parents, school faculty, and community. You are encouraged to come and visit our school to see firsthand how parent involvement, teacher dedication and industrious students make a successful school. You are invited to become part of our team to "Believe, Achieve and Succeed."
