
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide






### READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

For the second consecutive year, our school has received the Palmetto Silver Award. The award is given for improved test scores. Indeed, our faculty, staff, parents, and students are very proud to have received this honor for the second straight year.

Attached to the honor is a monetary award. For the first Palmetto Silver Award, the school received over \$11,000. A large portion of the award money was spent on incentive awards for our students. Students who had good behavior, excellent grades, good MAP scores, and exemplary citizenship during the 2008-2009 school year were treated to parties, movies, gift cards, and cookouts.

While having the additional money has been a blessing, financial challenges continue to be a concern for our school. Even so, the quality of instruction at our school continues to be good. The 2008-2009 school year was the second time in several years that our students were able to earn Carnegie Units for Algebra I and English I. On the end-of-course test in Algebra I, 100% of the students who took the test made an "A." On the end-of-the-course test in English I, 97% passed the test.

Although academic achievement is our focus, we continue to be proud of our students' accomplishments in other areas. Both of our soccer teams had perfect seasons. TMD and PMD students held an art exhibit at the Greenwood Arts Center in March 2009. Northside students volunteered to assist with the Miracle League Baseball Program.

Encouraging good citizenship is a daily priority for the faculty and staff. Coupling that with providing an outstanding academic program keeps everyone at the school busy. As we begin 2009-2010 with our theme, Scholarly Knights: A Northside Tradition, we are confident that each will continue to thrive.
