



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Marshall Primary School, in partnership with the total community, is to build a solid foundation for future learning by providing quality instruction while nurturing the uniqueness of each individual. Marshall Primary has a strong faculty and staff and an extremely active PTO. Parent volunteers logged over 2,000 hours of service during the 2008-2009 school year. The Marshall Primary PTO raised funds to sponsor the crossing guard each morning and afternoon, purchased home/school journals for each student, provided student incentives, and provided opportunities for parental involvement. Marshall Primary has an involved School Improvement Council and Title One Committee that meets regularly to discuss and set future goals. We are a school with high academic achievement and strong ties to the community.

Marshall Primary School has had many accomplishments including the following: students in grades one and two participated in the District's Achievement Test; all students in kindergarten through second grade participated in the Young Author's Program; students earned 17,036 points in the Accelerated Reading program; media center circulation was 27,218 books; Marshall Primary School hosted a 21st Century Community Learning Center; students in first and second grade participated in Math Masters, which reinforced and challenged new learning. Participating students scoring in the top percentage were rewarded with great opportunities such as a Fun in the Sun time with ice cream and inflatables, Wee Deliver, a school wide mail system, to encourage appropriate writing habits, two computer labs were maintained and utilized by all of our students, students served as news anchors during our closed-circuit morning news program, preschool and kindergarten classrooms reflected the standards on the Early Childhood Rating Scale, Wendy's Wonderful Kids and Positive Behavior Intervention Supports programs continued to promote character education, continued support from our business partners, parental involvement was emphasized through activities such as parent workshops, a Spring Fling, field day, Goodies with Grandparents, Arts in the School Night, and plays and concerts, students collected canned goods for disadvantaged families and raised money for the South Carolina Aquarium to equip Loggerhead Sea Turtles with satellite tracking devices, local veterans were honored on Veterans' Day; Birthday Buddies provided each student an opportunity to celebrate their birthday with either a friend or family member, with a guest speaker presenting topics on positive character trail, and Teddy Bear Helpers gave new students a tour of the school and were special buddies during those first few days of getting acclimated to a new environment.

Sandy Crowe was our Teacher of the Year. Our Teacher of the Year for 2009-2010 will be Angie Clinkscapes. The school's theme for the 2009-2010 school year holds true as students continue to "PAWS for Learning."
