



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Goose Creek Primary embarked on the 2008-09 school year with enthusiasm and commitment toward building the foundation for a community of learners. Kindergarten and first grade teachers refined differentiated instruction in reading by completing extensive training with The 95% Group. This training allowed teachers to more accurately determine reading strengths and deficits and provided a myriad of engaging small group lessons to increase students' reading skills. The ASSIST Lab was created to provide individualized mathematics intervention.

All students continued to benefit from GCP's second year as a Distinguished Arts School. Opportunities in the arts included drama, puppetry, African drumming, dance and even learning to play the harmonica. Our parents enjoyed the student performances that followed the Artist in Residence experiences.

Goose Creek Primary continued to serve 140 children in the Child Development Education Pilot Program providing high-quality readiness experiences for four-year olds. Our special education team initiated the first annual Young Athletes Day which provided a variety of challenging outdoor experiences for students with disabilities and their buddies.

Our pre-K through second grade students continued to learn through engaging experiences with Smartboards in every classroom and weekly computer classes. GCP opened its doors in the evening for parents to take English classes, hone computer skills, receive parenting skills training and attend fun Family Nights with their children.

As a PBIS school we taught and reinforced the importance of being respectful, responsible and ready to learn. Over 350 children attended the Principal's Pajama Party by earning Otter Bucks for demonstrating these three guiding principles.

We look forward to another year of learning at Goose Creek Primary.
