



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The 2009-2010 school year validated Anderson School District Four's commitment to providing Every Opportunity for Every Learner to Achieve! From the interactive digital learning environment to the arts and sports, our students took center stage, bringing pride home to our community. Efforts intensified in defining a culture that teaches and reinforces creativity and discovery, cultural and ethnic diversity, strong interpersonal skills, peaceful problem solving, and self-discipline and independence, as well as cooperation and teamwork – all skills of tomorrow's workforce. Together, both student and community moved in unison in preparation for life in the 21st century.

Specific moments of celebration included: Receiving District Accreditation from the AdvancED Accreditation Commission, the national commission that confers the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI) accreditation seal; posting a jump of 10 points up from 81% last year to 91% AYP this year in compliance for the 2009 Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) report (Pendleton Elementary met AYP for the first time since 2005; La France Elementary met AYP and avoided becoming a School of Choice; Mount Lebanon Elementary met AYP for the second consecutive time; Townville Elementary met AYP for the seventh consecutive time; Riverside Middle posted a 24% improvement gain by meeting 20 out of 21 objectives; and Pendleton High met AYP for its graduation rate (83.3%) for the first time since 2005); out-scoring the state average in "met" and "exemplary" categories in 95% of the tested areas on the 2009 administration of South Carolina's Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) tests; Townville Elementary School being honored as one of three elementary schools in South Carolina to be named a National Distinguished Title I School for Student Achievement; Pendleton High being named one of the top high schools in the country by U.S. News & World Report; La France Elementary School's archery team taking state honors at the Palmetto Sportsmen Classic; Pendleton High's Pride of Pendleton Band winning the 2009 SCBDA State Marching Band Championship; Girls' Cross Country taking runner-up in the state 1A/2A championship; and FFA Chapter winning 7 state championship titles, which set a new state record previously held since 1928; unveiling of the district's new website, PowerSchool's parent portal, and Edulink emergency notification system; and the class of 2010 earning \$2,135,972.00 in scholarship awards.

The 2009-2010 year will also be known for the tough economic times public education continues to face in South Carolina as severe and repeated budget cuts result in 1995 funding levels, a historic low. While this funding landscape has forced us to rethink program offerings, no employees lost jobs, related arts offerings continue, and the commitment to quality instruction has strengthened. We believe our children's education must be first. Our students must be prepared for global opportunities to compete on the world stage. The future is now!
